RULES & REGULATIONS – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. All showing of horses and ponies will take place **indoors**. Horse entries for Classes 1-2, inclusive, Horse & Pony Classes, **IN ARENA SEE HORSE COORDINATOR Mark Law, 8:00-close 9:30 am SHARP**, Sunday, July 21, 2024. Horse show starts **10:00 AM**. **FOR ADVANCED ENTRIES & INQUIRIES – Call/Text: Mark Law, 743-2049**. In all Horse & Pony Classes, entry fee of **\$3.00** per section entered shall be paid at time of registering entries **Plus \$5.00 ENTRY FEE** for Cypress River Agricultural Society. **ALL** horse cheques will be mailed out **AFTER** the fair. **Please ensure mailing address is complete with Box # & phone number – Ag. Society will not be responsible for lost or non-delivery of cheques. A deposit of \$20.00 per day for use of stalls – if cleaned out prior to leaving – deposit will be returned.**

2. ENTRY for **CLASS 3** - To sign up your team please contact **Derek Verstraete**. Call/Text: 204-526-0904 or Email: verstraete18@hotmail.com. ****Deadline** for signup is July 15, 2024.

3. ENTRIES for **CLASSES 4-20** must be **IN PLACE** to be judged by **10:00 am, Saturday, July 15, 2024. Advanced entries may be phoned in to Linda Truelove, 743-2113.** ALL EXHIBITS IN THESE CLASSES MUST REMAIN IN PLACE UNTIL **4:00 pm, Sunday, July 21, 2024** under penalty of forfeiting any prize awarded.

4. **ONE ENTRY PER SECTION PER PERSON OR BOTH ARTICLES WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.**

5. Any Exhibitor may show as many articles as he or she wishes on one entry fee of **\$5.00**. No persons who have not paid an entry fee, except Junior Exhibitors (See Note Below), shall be allowed to exhibit. ***NOTE:** A **\$3.00** entry fee is required for Junior Exhibitors, **age 16 & under**, entering only in Classes for Junior Exhibitors, but if a Junior Exhibitor enters Class(es) that are open to anyone, an entry fee of **\$5.00** is required.

6. In all other classes, the Society shall retain 10% of all prize monies \$5.00 and over, (**EXCEPT SPECIALS**), earned by each Exhibitor. **Prizes under \$20.00** will be paid out in cash and a signature will be required. **PRIZES ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE.**

7. All exhibits must be the Exhibitor's **PROPERTY OR PRODUCED ON ONE'S FARM OR HOLDING**: all Exhibits in Classes 4-20 must be the work of the Exhibitor and all exhibits **MUST HAVE BEEN COMPLETED IN THE PREVIOUS 12 MONTHS.**

8. All EXHIBITS with the exception of horses/ponies, and houseplants, **MUST NOT HAVE BEEN EXHIBITED** at a Cypress River Fair in **ANY PREVIOUS YEAR.**

9. In Sections where a definite number of articles is asked for, all Exhibits must contain the exact number specified, or automatically be disqualified.

10. All Exhibitors shall be **PERSONALLY** responsible for setting up and removing their exhibit items.

11. Only one prize will be allowed to any Exhibitor in any one Section in any Class, except horses/ponies' classes. ***SEE SPECIAL RULING IN HORSE & PONY CLASSES.**

12. NO PERSON SHALL BE ALLOWED TO INTERFERE WITH THE JUDGES WHILE IN CHARGE OF THEIR DUTIES. Exhibitors so interfering will forfeit their right to any premiums to which they might otherwise be entitled. In the event that an Exhibitor acts in an abusive manner towards a Judge or a Director, he/she shall be asked to leave the grounds immediately.

13. Judges' decisions shall be final, unless appealed as hereinafter provided. Every grievance, complaint, and protest must be in writing and lodged with the Secretary and shall be accompanied by a \$10.00 grievance fee for each appeal in question, which will be returned to the complainant if the appeal is sustained. (***NOTE: FOR HORSES/PONIES CLASSES GRIEVANCES MUST BE MADE WHILE JUDGES ARE STILL ON THE GROUNDS**).

14. In the absence of competition, the Judges may award First, Second, Third, or **NO** prize, according to the merit of the exhibit and shall have in their power to withhold any premium for any animal or article which they consider unworthy of same, or prize money may be reduced to 75%.

15. Placing's are to be indicated by the Judges at the conclusion of judging of each Section of each Class.

16. Articles on exhibit shall not be handled except by the Directors and Judge of the Department to which they belong.

17. **The Society RESERVES THE RIGHT TO LIMIT THE TOTAL PRIZE LIST to an amount equal to the net receipts. In the event of net receipts being insufficient to allow the prize list to be paid in full, each prize will be prorated accordingly, and all the entries are made and received in this distinct understanding. This regulation applies to every class of entry.**

18. The Society shall not be responsible for any damage to or loss of any exhibit; however, the Society will take reasonable precautions to prevent damage or loss. Exhibitors and spectators shall participate at their own discretion.

19. Exhibitors will please communicate any complaint or grievance, in writing, mailed to the Society, Box 194, repayments of prize money to the Treasurer within 10 days of the receipt of prize money.

20. All cheques **MUST** be **cashd within 60 days** of the receipt. ****NOTE: ANY EXHIBITOR ISSUING AN NSF CHEQUE WILL BE CHARGED \$10.00 OVER AND ABOVE THE NSF CHARGE OF THE BANKING INSTITUTION.**

21. Any infringement of the Rules will be punished by withdrawing the prizes, expulsion from the Society, or both.

22. Directors reserve the right to place an exhibit in a more appropriate Class or make a new Class.

HINTS TO EXHIBITORS:

Vegetables on exhibit should be uniform in size and shape, according to their respective variety. May be washed to remove dirt, or rub gently with a soft brush or cloth. Multiplier onions are not to be completely separated but spread apart gently to reveal whole cluster. Cut all tops off all onion varieties evenly to leave approximately 8-10 cm (3"-4") of top. Trim onion roots. Trim tops of beets, turnips to 4-5 cm (2"). Trim tops of carrots to 1-2 cm (1"). Garden Corn: show whole plant including root (side shoots detract from the exhibit). Collection: must be neatly and attractively arranged and labelled neatly. **Dry wash vegetables.**

HINTS: Basic Hints for Flower Arranging: Use oasis or something to hold plants in place, stems shouldn't show. Prop up single stems. Be sure flowers are fresh. Remove dead or withered leaves and flowers. Be sure you have the exact number called for. **NOTE:** Exhibitors **NO** prohibited plants such as lythrium and the perennial "Baby's Breath" (Gysophila).

AG SOCIETY DOES NOT KEEP WINNING QUILTS - EXHIBITOR TAKES HIS/HER OWN QUILT HOME UNTIL THE QUILT COORDINATOR CONTACTS THEM - TO BE JUDGED AT A LATER TIME.

NOTE: Quilts will be disqualified if they do not meet any of the required standards.

1. Competition is open to all quilt exhibitors.
2. The judging criteria are included in the “Judging Standards” Fair book.
- 3. AT TIME OF ENTRY, EXHIBITORS MUST INDICATE THEIR INTEREST IN BEING CONSIDERED FOR “THE QUILTING” COMPETITION.**
4. Quilts may be entered in four categories:
 - hand quilted
 - domestic/mid arm – fabric is manipulated by hand under a fixed machine.
 - track (mid/long arm) – this includes where the machine rides on wheels and moves over the fabric and the machine is hand guided. No computer programmed quilting will be allowed.
 - computerized quilting – where the quilting design has been computer programmed.
5. The quilt must be completely done by the person submitting the quilt.
6. No commercial quilting will be allowed (machine quilted by someone other than the exhibitor).
7. Quilts must have an appropriate title & give appropriate credit to pattern designer if not original.
8. Quilts must be clean; any with stains and/or markings; pet hair will not be accepted.
9. Quilts **MUST** have a perimeter of at least 240 inches (590 cm) to be considered for the competition.
10. A fabric quilt label must be attached to the bottom right corner on the backside of the quilt entry. Labels must be covered at all judging levels.
11. Quilts must be delivered/packaged in a durable and labeled clear plastic bag for handling.
12. Quilters must sign a release form when the quilt is entered at the local event.
13. A Judges Score Sheet will be distributed to all Societies, which must be used to judge the quilts. Any quilt not scoring 70 or more points will not qualify for the District or Provincial Competition.

14. Each Society may select up to eight quilts (2 hand quilted, 2 domestics, 2 track and 2 computerized) at their Fair to participate in the District Competition. Up to a total of eight quilts will be chosen at the District Competition to go on to the Provincial Competition.
15. Exhibitors may enter more than one quilt in this competition. However, they may only have ONE in each category advance to the Provincial Competition.
16. Any quilt may be entered in competition at as many Fairs as the Exhibitor wishes. However, it may only represent the Society where it was first entered in the Provincial Competition and won. The Exhibitor **MUST** advise "Societies" at the time of entry if their quilt is a winner at a previous fair.
17. If an exhibitor does not wish to participate in the Provincial Competition, the runner-up quilt with a score higher than 70 will be selected to represent the Society in the District Competition.
18. At the district level prize monies will be awarded for the top quilts in each category. At the provincial finals, there will be prize monies available in the Hand Quilted, Domestic, Track and Computerized Categories.
19. All District Winners/Provincial Entries will be held for display at the Provincial Quilt Finals; and are encouraged to be available for the 2024 Red River Exhibition. Quilters are responsible to deliver/pick up their quilt(s).
